

Avoid Electrical Hazards with Your Devices

You need to be careful with any product that has a power cord. Once phones, laptops, and other devices are plugged into an outlet it becomes a potential hazard. As long as they are unplugged they do not have enough power to kill you.



- Respect your phone: Your devices can be dangerous, so be mindful of those threats. Think twice before going into the bathroom with any device that's plugged in.
- Use the right charger: Stick to chargers approved by the manufacturer. Make sure they have a UL mark signifying that they have been put through a UL certification process.
- Test your ground-fault outlets: Push the "test" button, and it should make a quiet popping sound. Anything that is plugged into the outlet should go dead. Push the reset button for the outlet to come back on.
- Don't depend on extension cords: Extension cords are not meant for long-term use. Do not use an extension cord anywhere that it might get wet.
- Seat your plugs securely: Outlets do wear out, so if they're sagging instead of holding your plug securely, it's time to replace them.
